Civil Service Reform and Decentralization

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The paradox of civil service reform is that democratisation may be best achieved through the centralised structure which it will ultimately undermine. Proper ordering of the reform process will use the strong culture of centralised, hierarchical institutions to instill democratic training: democratisation should precede decentralisation.
