Style-Shifting and Audience Design Theory "[Allan] Bell's (1977, 1984) Audience Design Theory (AD) states that people engage in style-shifting normally in response to audience members rather than to shifts of attention paid to speech. In this way, 'intra-speaker [within speaker] variation is a response to interspeaker [between speakers] variation, chiefly as manifested in one's interlocutors ...

To study syntactic variation through quantitative variationist methods, unless the variable occurs at high frequency like the copula or agreement, a thirty minute sociolinguistic interview will most likely not be able to capture enough instances of a syntactic variable to make accurate predictions about frequency or use.

In a variation if variables change proportionately i.e. they either increase or decrease together then it is direct variations. Therefore, if X is in direct variation with Y, then you can symbolically write it as $X \propto Y$. In inverse or indirect variations, the variables change disproportionately.
