Additional Research on the Benefits of Pretend Play Studies show that the importance of pretend play in child development extends beyond simply language development. Smith and Simon (1984) found that play can enhance children's creativity and problem solving skills.

Pretend play has been claimed to be crucial to children's healthy development. The Impact of Pretend Play on Children's Development: A ...

Pretend play helps your child understand the power of language. In addition, by pretend playing with others, he learns that words give him the means to reenact a story or organize play. This process helps your child to make the connection between spoken and written language — a skill that will later help him learn to read.

The impact of pretend play on cognitive and academic ...

An important benefit of early pretend play may be its enhancement of the child's capacity for cognitive flexibility and, ultimately, creativity (Russ, 2004; Singer & Singer, 2005).

The Need for Pretend Play in Child Development ...

Pretend play has also been correlated with two crucial skill sets—the ability to self-regulate (impulses, emotions, attention) and the ability to reason counterfactually. First, studies report that kids who engage in frequent, pretend play have stronger self-regulation skills.

The cognitive benefits of play: Effects on the learning brain

Pretend play is often discussed, yet rarely understood. A child can engage in fantastic play since early childhood with the purpose of developing certain skills and abilities (e.g. : cognitive skills, language and literacy abilities, creativity abilities, emotional benefits and social skills).

Benefits of Pretend Play for Child Development

As a means of psychological distancing, pretend play may facilitate emotion regulation. Up to now, however, the empirical evidence for a relation between these two is not consistent. The present study examines the impact of pretend play on reflective emotion regulation of expression with a disappointing gift task using the strategy of role-taking.

Bewitched to Be Happy? The Impact of Pretend Play on ...

After reviewing correlational and experimental studies of play, Lillard and her coauthors find little causal evidence of the impact of pretend play on later development. Instead, they conclude that viewing the influence of pretend play through the perspective of epiphenomenalism or equifinality better fits the current evidence.

Pretending to Play or Playing to Pretend

They conclude that, because pretend play requires intervention for the majority of children with autism, improving pretense in these children may shed more light on the causal impact of pretense on later developing skills in children. 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The manner by which pretend play contributes to children's cognitive development has gained increasing interest recently. Play provides children with opportunities to develop their cognitive skills and make connections between different areas of activities and experiences (Wood, 2008).

Pretend play and the development of children's language ...

You play an important role in helping infants and toddlers expand their ability to imagine and pretend - from how you interact with them to the toys you offer. Engage young children in activities that develop symbolic play and encourage imagination. Give babies a variety of toys - rattles to shake, squeaking toys to pat, plastic blocks to bang.

Children in non-imaginative play and control conditions showed no improvements. Children who were highly engaged in the fantastical play showed the greatest gains. Children whose play was highly fantastical also demonstrated the greatest gains.
